The purpose of the awards is to recognize and acknowledge businesses and residents for achievements in town during the year. We hope that the award recipients know that the township is grateful for their hard work and dedication to our community. As you will read, the recipients were given awards for a range of reasons.

### Citizen of the Year 2020



***Mrs. Marian Johnson.*** Mrs. Johnson has been a very active and involved Edgewater Park resident for the past 15 years. Throughout this time, she was the Recreation Coordinator managing events such as the Memorial Day Parade, Summer Camp, Christmas with Santa, and Breakfast with the Bunny. She has been a member of the Edgewater Park Planning Board for the past 12 years, serving as Chairwoman for 11 of those years! Besides the Planning Board, she has also been Secretary of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks #2550 for the past six years. In this role she was personally responsible for writing several grants that were approved and enabled the Elks Organization to make a large donation to the Beverly Methodist Church food bank as well as other projects, as detailed in the March edition of the Beverly Bee and on our Township website.

## Outstanding Service Recognition Award

## Business of the Year 2020

Known by his customers as “Jay”, he kept his business, located on Cooper Street, a frontline business during the entire pandemic by keeping his convenience store open. ## Outstanding Community Service Award

**Mr Donald Dahlman** accepted the award on behalf of the **Edgewater Park Elks Lodge #2550**. During the Pandemic, the Elks remained active in supporting the community and beyond!

The Edgewater Park Elks Lodge 2550 is one of the smaller lodges with a membership of 131 dedicated members who tend to focus their efforts in helping within their own community as well as participation with the State and National Programs. The Lodge is located at 315 Green Street in Edgewater Park and considers its community to include Edgewater Park, Beverly, Delanco, Riverside, Delran, Riverton, Cinnaminson, Palmyra, Pennsauken and the Cities of Burlington and Camden as its local community area.



**To summarize the article about our Elks Lodge, published in the March Beverly Bee...**

In May of 2020 the Elks took advantage of several *Elks National Foundation Grants*, starting with the **Gratitude Grant** which enabled the Lodge to donate \$2000 to **Beverly United Methodist Church “Meals of Love”** program to help them provide food, groceries, and cleaning products to anyone in need.



The Lodge’s **Veterans Service Committee** in September of 2020 used the **Beacon Grant** to provide \$2500 of products to help the homeless in the community by partnering with **Healthy Soles of Camden** & the **Beverly Library**, to give 200 personal hygiene care packages to help our citizens living on the streets. The **Beacon Grant** provided \$1000 to buy 30 new winter coats for the 30 Veterans residing in temporary transition housing through **Home of the Brave** in Camden. The Veterans Committee also collected approximately \$500 of non-perishable food products from local citizens and Lodge members for the **Home of the Brave Pantry**.



In October 2020, **Beverly United Methodist Church “Meals of Love”** program used the Elks’ \$2000 **Spotlight Grant** to help provide food during the Thanksgiving season. In all, the Elks Lodge provided local community organizations with \$7500 from just three Grants applied for in 2020. The Veterans Committee also organized a **Thanksgiving Food Drive** by distributing 32 Thanksgiving Dinner Baskets to community members in need.



This extended to the Veterans Committee's **2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Toys for Tots** drive by partnering with the **Riverside Police Department, Beverly Fire Department** and a few local businesses who graciously allowed Elks' drop boxes within their establishments. Thanks to local citizens, several motorcycle organizations and 3 other Elks Lodges, Lodge #2550 delivered approximately \$1800 worth of new unwrapped toys and \$575 in cash and checks donated during the drive and also supported the United States Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots Program.



During the Thanksgiving Drive the Elks identified a young mother who is struggling and did a quick fundraiser to help provide a memorable Christmas for her two young daughters. They delivered enough food for a delicious and healthy Christmas meal, with extra items to help sustain the family for several more meals. The young girls received multiple gifts and toys and two bicycles... all donated by Lodge 2550 Members and citizens within the community.

In 2021, the Veterans Committee has raised \$900 for a February donation to the **New Jersey Mission of Honor** to help them locate and provide dignified burials of Veterans cremated remains sitting on shelves throughout the state.

These charitable endeavors help Elks Lodge 2550 meet its mission to be part of the community. The organization continues to help and partner with other local government organizations and community-based organizations to help youth through the **Youth Activities Committee**; children and adults with special needs through the **Special Needs Children Committee**; to promote patriotism and civic duty through the **Americanism Committee**; and to provide resources to Veterans, Active Military Members and their Families through the **Veterans Service Committee**.
