even minimal upkeep costs, such as grass mowing, which costs more than \$16,000.00 per year.

On September 18, 2022, the Edgewater Park community-at-large gathered at an Open House for Monument Cemetery to remember those Veterans who served our country and had resided in our surrounding communities.

We have formed a small fundraising committee to address some more immediate financial needs and commitments of the cemetery. The committee is comprised of American Legion members, local Vets from different branches of service, and other community leaders:

In 1999, Monument Cemetery added a Veterans Section, *Garden of Honor* for local Veterans. I have met with Mr. Ralph Ulissi, Monument Cemetery Board of Trustees, on several occasions to consider ideas for funding. This historic Monument Cemetery, created in 1865 near the Beverly National Cemetery, is looking to the public for financial assistance to maintain the cemetery itself, as well as promote the *Veterans Garden of Honor*.

Last year the cemetery only sold a dozen gravesites at \$900 each for income of less than \$12,000, and it also received some monthly interest from a statemandated trust account into which it deposits a portion of the cemetery income. The principle of that account is untouchable at this point.

The cemetery has not been selling enough gravesites to generate sufficient income to pay for


and Ms. Judy Hall; plus, PTO representative Karen McLaughlin; and Elks Veterans Committee Chair
