RESOLUTION NO. 2012-80

Resolution Appointing a Licensed Site Remediation Professional

WHEREAS, New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Site Remediation Reform
Act (SRRRA) of 2009 established an affirmative obligation for responsible parties to remediate
contaminated sites in a timely manner; and

WHEREAS, SRRRA also requires responsible parties to hire a Licensed Site Remediation
Professional (LSRP) to oversee the remediation; and

WHEREAS, SRRRA requires municipalities to hire a Licensed Site Remediation Professional
(LSRP) no later than May 7, 2012 to oversee the investigation and cleanup of any sites for
which it is responsible; and

WHEREAS, a municipality that owns contaminated property for which it is not a responsible
party is not required, but is strongly encouraged to adhere to these deadlines.

WHEREAS, in order to make this determination it was deemed necessary to go out on
competitive quote, and this contractor was low quote in the base hourly amount of \$115.00; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:87 provides that the Director of the Division of Local Government Services may approve the insertion of any special item of revenue in the budget of any county or municipality when such items shall have been made available by law and the amount thereof was not determined at the time of the adoption of the budget; and

WHEREAS, said Director may also approve the insertion of any item of appropriation for equal amount;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Township Committee of the Township of Edgewater Park in the County of Burlington, New Jersey, hereby requests the Director of Local Government Services to approve the insertion of an item of revenue in the budget of the year 2012 in the sum of \$13,604.23, which item is now available from the State of New Jersey, Clean Communities Grant 2012, the amount of \$13,604.23;

Mr. Pullion reported Bottom Dollar will open in June.

Mr. Pullion further reported Edgewater Park appeared in the May 2nd publication of the South Jersey Magazine for rankings in South Jersey. Mr. Pullion discussed that Edgewater Park was not ranked in 2011 but we were ranked in 2012. In the category of communities with populations greater than (8,000), we placed sixth (6) out of the top ten (10) towns in Burlington County. For the Tri-County region (Burlington, Camden and Gloucester Counties) overall we ranked 13 out of the top 25. The most impressive change was that when looking at the lowest residential taxes per average residential value in the tri-county area, we placed 7 out of 25. The Township's average property assessment increased to \$195,000.
