This federally-funded project will construct extensions of the Delaware River Heritage Trail through Louis Kite Field and Memorial Field and connect existing segments through Woodlake Park and Roosevelt Park in Edgewater Park Township, Burlington County, NJ. On-road improvements will improve safety along York Drive, Lincoln Avenue, Roosevelt Avenue, and the public parking lots. A new signalized trail crossing will be provided at Woodlane Road and York Drive, and the Stevenson Avenue Access Ramp to Memorial Field will be replaced to meet current ADA standards. The trail will terminate on Cooper Street in close proximity to the Beverly/Edgewater Park River Line Station. Please see the enclosed Project Fact Sheet for more information about the project.

## HERITAGE TRAIL SHARED USE PATH AND ON-ROAD IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT FACT SHEET

### **Project Location**

This project will construct new segments of the Delaware River Heritage Trail through Louis Kite Field and Memorial Field and connect existing segments through Woodlake Park and Roosevelt Park in Edgewater Park Township, Burlington County, NJ. On-road improvements will improve safety along York Drive, Lincoln Avenue, Roosevelt Avenue, and the public parking lots. A new signalized trail crossing will be provided at Woodlane Road and York Drive, and the Stevenson Avenue Access Ramp to Memorial Field will be replaced to meet current ADA standards. The trail will terminate on Cooper Street in close proximity to the Beverly/Edgewater Park River Line Station.

### **Project Purpose**

The purpose of this project is to construct approximately 0.5 miles of new off-road multi-use path and 1 mile of on-road improvements to create additional recreational opportunities, encourage alternative modes of transportation and provide safer connections to nearby destinations for Edgewater Park residents. The Delaware River Heritage Trail (DRHT) is envisioned as a 60-mile long loop highlighting the cultural and natural resources along the scenic river. The DRHT will link communities from Trenton to Palmyra on the New Jersey side and is a component of the regional Circuit Trails network. The project promotes and facilitates the increased use of non-motorized transportation and will attract users from the surrounding communities.

### **Project Need**

Bicyclists and pedestrians currently travel alongside vehicular traffic on Woodlane Road, Franklin Avenue, Warren Street, and Cooper Street to travel east and west through Edgewater Park. The unsignalized crossings, parked cars, and lack of dedicated road space make safe and efficient travel through the residential areas difficult. Non-compliant ADA curb ramps and driveways present accessibility barriers for pedestrians using public facilities.

### **Project Description**

The project improvements are identified below.

- Protected Two-Way Cycle Track along York Drive from the DRHT at Woodlake Park to Woodlane Rd
- Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) for the trail crossing at Woodlane Road and York Drive
- 0.15 miles of new 10-foot wide porous asphalt trail through Kite Field
- Protected Two-Way Cycle Track and walkway through the Kite Field Parking lot with striping improvements
- Share The Road pavement markings and signage along Lincoln Ave and Roosevelt Ave to the trail at Roosevelt Park
- 0.35 miles of new 10-foot wide porous asphalt trail from the Roosevelt Park Parking lot to Memorial Field and across the parking lot up to Cooper St.
- Replacement of the Access Ramp from Stevenson Ave to Memorial Field to meet ADA compliance.
- Porous asphalt path connecting the Stevenson Ave Access Ramp to the new trail
- Rest areas with benches and bicycle racks along the new trail
- Wayfinding signage directing bicyclists and pedestrians to the trail and nearby community destinations
